This application must be accompanied by a **non-refundable deposit of \$100** which is applied to your participation fees. A refund will be made only in the event that you are not selected as an adult jamboree leader.

**DATES: July 26 – August 4, 2010 (travel may change final dates!)**

**WHAT IS A NATIONAL JAMBOREE?** A national jamboree is an encampment of Scouts and unit leaders with the purpose of providing a dramatic demonstration of Scouting's ability to develop world brotherhood, a spirit of friendship, and a source of understanding among young people through fellowship, activities, and adventure. Most of the participants will come from the Boy Scouts of America, although some of the countries with Scout associations will be represented.

**2010 NATIONAL SCOUT JAMBOREE OVERVIEW:** The 2010 National Scout Jamboree will celebrate the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Boy Scouts of America. It will be held in late July and early August 2010 and will bring together more than 40,000 Scouts, leaders and staff for 10 days. Along with the National Jamboree, our Council's Contingent has the option of including additional days for touring historic spots in and around the Washington D.C. area, so potentially, the entire trip may cover 15 or more days.

**WHERE IS THE JAMBOREE?** The jamboree will take place in Caroline County, Virginia on a portion of the U.S. Army installation Fort A.P. Hill. This area is roughly one hour south of Washington D.C., just outside of Fredericksburg, VA.

**HOW DO I APPLY?** Each provisional troop will consist of 3 adult leaders over age 21 and one leader between the age of 18 and 21. Adults who are interested in serving as one of the leaders for our contingents need to complete this application and submit it to the council office by the deadline. Once applications are received you will be contact to schedule your interview date and time. The Jamboree Selection Committee will conduct an in person interview with each candidate. Once the selection committee has made their choices you will be notified as to your status. Those who are not selected as troop leaders are still eligible and encouraged to attend the Jamboree as members of the Jamboree Staff. Please see the back of this application for details on deadlines, interview dates and locations.

**TRAVEL, COSTS & PAYMENT SCHEDULE:** All leaders will travel with the contingent as part of the tour that is arranged by our council jamboree committee. Cost for leaders will be determined once the final tour plans are made, but are expected to be approximately \$1,800. These fees will cover the majority of all costs, although additional expenses such as required uniforms or personal equipment would not be included. Once the fee is established, a payment schedule will be determined.

### **JAMBOREE CONTINGENT LEADER COMMITMENTS**

- Sign the Participant Statement of Understanding and Code of Conduct
- Agree to strictly follow all BSA policies and procedures (both national and local) regarding all aspects of the jamboree.
- Maintain a positive attitude and cooperate with all other contingent leaders and Council National Jamboree Committee members.

**TIME COMMITMENT**

- Attend Council National Jamboree Committee meetings each month from when they begin until summer/fall of 2010.
- Attend monthly contingent troop meetings starting Spring of 2008 and other troop functions as needed
- Assist with recruiting Scout participants
- Complete Youth Protection Training before attending the jamboree
- Attend the entire Pre-jamboree Training Weekend in spring of 2010 (Friday afternoon through Sunday noon)
- Attend the full jamboree (possibly as many as 15 days)
- Prior to attending the jamboree contact each Scout's home troop Scoutmaster to gain better knowledge of the Scout.

**FINANCIAL COMMITMENT**

- Final costs for the contingent leaders have not yet been determined; however, preliminary estimates are \$1,800.
- Each participant is required to have a minimum of two complete official BSA uniforms (short sleeved shirts, shorts, belt, socks, & proper patches). Numerous miscellaneous fees (i.e. extra CSP commemorative patches, etc.) will be the responsibility of the participant. At least one shakedown will be required.

## APPLICANT'S STATEMENT

If selected, I agree to live by the Scout Oath and Law, to obey and cooperate with all jamboree leaders, to be a goodwill ambassador for the Central Florida Council and the state of Florida, to meet my full responsibilities as a member of the Central Florida Council contingent, to take such preliminary jamboree training as may be required, to wear the official National Scout Jamboree uniform, and to follow the Code of Conduct.

I certify that I have now or will attain the age and the qualifications that are required of all adult leaders; as such age and qualifications are listed on this application.

I further agree to submit evidence of fitness to make this trip on the Personal Health and Medical Record Form, signed by a licensed health-care practitioner, and that I will obtain immunizations required by the health services of the jamboree. I understand the medical record form for the jamboree is a special issue form that will be provided to me through the council jamboree committee.

This application includes my request for personal accident and sickness insurance to be purchased in my behalf. The cost of this insurance is included in the jamboree fee. It is understood that payment of claims by the insurance company or companies is contingent upon prompt reporting of claims, if any, by the applicant.

I understand that the jamboree will be covered by news media and filmmaking or broadcasting companies, and I hereby consent to the use of my voice and/or photograph in the news coverage, filmmaking, or similar projects approved by the Boy Scouts of America.

### Interviews

To provide a process that allows all interested leaders an opportunity to serve as a jamboree leader everyone who applies will be contacted to schedule an interview. Interviews will be offered on four different dates and locations, below is a list of dates and locations. Interviews will be schedule between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. The purpose of the interview is for the selection committee to meet you and get to know you and hear first hand about your Scouting experience and why you would make a great jamboree leader. You are expected to wear your Scout uniform. If for any reason you can not make your scheduled appointment you must notify the committee 24 hours in advance in order to be scheduled for another date and location.
