What is the National Jamboree?

Every four years, the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America organizes the ultimate Boy Scout Experience, the National Jamboree! In 2005, over 40,000 Scouts and Scouters attended the Jamboree. Activities include: rifle shooting, bikathlons, scuba diving, fishing, trapshooting, canoe slalom, rappelling towers, pioneering, Action Alley, kayaking, 4-way volleyball, Buckskin Games, a huge merit badge midway, daily stage shows, the Order of the Arrow American Indian Village, and much, much more!



Qualifications - This information is based on past Jamboree qualifications and may change.

It is anticipated that a Scout must have completed the sixth grade or be at least 12 years old by July 1, 2010; attain the rank of First Class by July 1, 2010; have a completed Class 3 National Jamboree physical issued to each participant by the national office of the BSA; participate in the pre-jamboree training; be active in his troop six months prior to July 1, 2010; and be approved by his Scoutmaster and the Central Florida Council Jamboree Committee. His 18th birthday may not be before August 2, 2010.



Organization, Transportation, Food and Equipment

Participants will be placed in Central Florida Council troops. Once troops are formed and leaders are selected, participants receive information through the Jamboree Troop Scoutmaster.

It is anticipated that we will have 10 troops, each consisting of 36 Scouts and four adult leaders. Side trips and tours have not been decided on. In 2005 we had an option for Scouts to be in a Troop that toured Washington DC or to be in a Troop that did not tour. There was an additional cost for those who wanted to tour Washington.



Cost

The cost of the 2005 Jamboree was \$1,200 for the non touring Troops and \$1,800 for those who toured DC. We do not have projected costs for 2010. Every effort will be made to make the fee as low a price as possible, while preserving the quality of the Jamboree experience. This will cover the National Jamboree fee, travel and tour expenses, meals, lodging, troop equipment, accident and sickness insurance, troop numbers, patrol medallions, and the cost of pre-jamboree training

Application

Due to the 100th Anniversary, an overwhelming response is expected. You will need to apply early to ensure your place in line, as spaces will be filled on a first-come first-served basis. While the official applications for the 2010 Jamboree are not yet available, you may better ensure your place in line by completing the interest form below and returning it the Council office.
